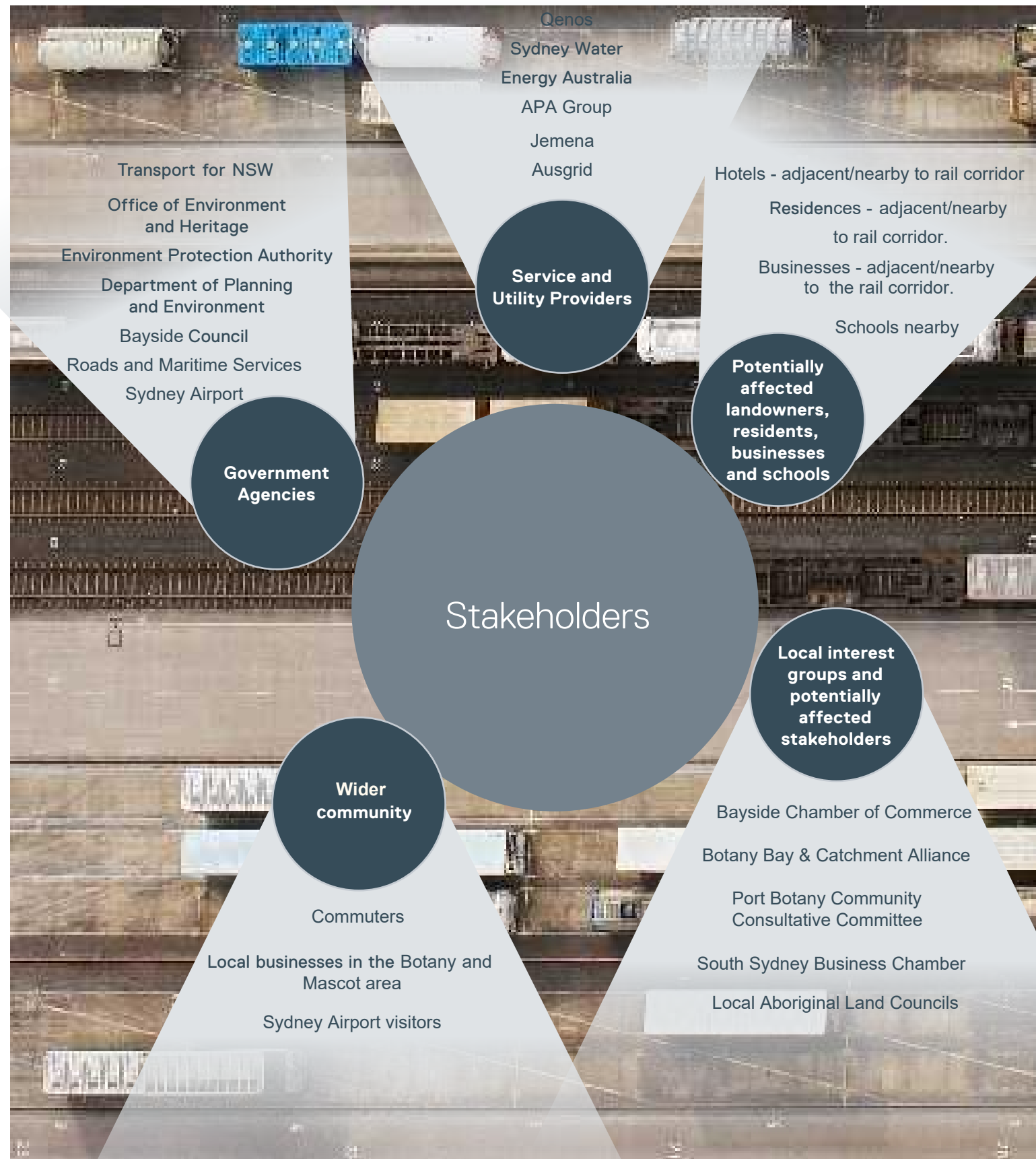


COMMUNITY AND STAKEHOLDERS

BOTANY RAIL DUPLICATION

In May 2018, the Federal Government announced its commitment to the Botany Rail Duplication and Cabramatta Loop Projects.

Transporting freight by rail to Port Botany is a key priority in order to support the economic growth of Sydney. Duplication of the remaining 2.9km section of track between Botany and Mascot will enable greater efficiencies in the rail freight system, help meet future freight demand and support the NSW Government's targets to increase the use of rail transportation.

The Botany Rail Duplication Project includes the following key features:

- Track duplication - Construction of a second track predominantly within the rail corridor from Mascot (near King Street) to Botany (near Banksia Street) for a distance of 2.9km.
- Track realignment (slewing) and upgrading – moving some sections of track sideways (slewing) and upgrading some sections of track to improve the alignment of both tracks and minimise boundary impacts.
- New crossovers - Installation of new rail crossovers to maintain and improve access at two locations.

- New bridges to provide for the new track at Mill Pond, Southern Cross Drive, O’Riordan Street and Robey Street.
- Re-constructing existing bridges at O’Riordan Street and Robey Street.
- Embankment / Retaining structures - Constructing a new embankment and retaining structure adjacent to Qantas Drive between Robey and O’Riordan Streets and a new embankment between the Mill Stream and Botany Road bridges.

The Botany Rail Duplication Project is a key Australian Rail Track Corporation (ARTC) initiative to support the Sydney Metropolitan Freight Strategy 2015–2024 and NSW Freight and Ports Plan 2018–2023.

The Botany Rail Duplication Project is a State significant infrastructure project and is therefore subject to State Government planning approval.



COMMUNITY AND STAKEHOLDER ENGAGEMENT

This *Engagement Plan* outlines the engagement proposed during the environmental assessment and reference design phases for the Botany Rail Duplication (the Project), for which we are the proponent.

There are four main Stages to the Botany Rail Duplication.



Timing - 2015 - 2017

STAGE 1 SCOPING

This stage includes scoping of the Project and undertaking a preliminary environmental assessment to inform the Secretary's Environmental Assessment Requirements.



2019 in 2020

STAGE 2A DEVELOPMENT

Reference Design and Environmental Assessment to inform the development of an EIS. This will be a vital stage to gather and consider feedback from stakeholders and the community.



2020 in late-2022

STAGE 2B EXHIBITION OF THE EIS

Engagement activities will focus on explaining the EIS, specialist studies and information stakeholders about how they can make a formal submission to the Department of Planning and Environment.



2020 in late-2020 to 2024

STAGE 3 DELIVERY

Following receipt of Infrastructure Approval, this stage will include the development of detailed design and construction of the Project.



2024 in 2024

STAGE 4 OPERATION

This stage will cover the maintenance and operation of the Project as part of the Metropolitan Freight Network.
