## 1 Introduction

### 1.1 Project background

The Australian and New South Wales (NSW) governments have identified clear objectives to increase the share of freight moved by rail- from $17.5 \%$ in 2016 to $28 \%$ by 2021. Increasing demand for freight rail will put more pressure on existing rail infrastructure, which includes the Southern Sydney Freight Line (SSFL). In May 2018, the Prime Minister announced the Australian Government's commitment of $\$ 400$ million to the Port Botany Rail Line Duplication Project (including Cabramatta Loop), with the aim of achieving the governments' objective to increase the share of freight moved by rail.

The Australian Rail Track Corporation (ARTC) are the Proponent for the Cabramatta Loop Project (the Project), which involves the construction and operation of a passing loop on the SSFL to enable freight trains up to 1,300 metres in length to pass each other. The Project is partly located within the existing rail corridor between the Hume Highway and Cabramatta Road East road overbridges in the suburbs of Warwick Farm and Cabramatta. The Project also includes works in Broomfield Street and Jacquie Osmond Reserve (JO Reserve) adjacent to the rail corridor.

Key features of the Project are shown in Figure 1.
The Project is declared Critical State Significant Infrastructure (CSSI) under State Environmental Planning Policy (State and Regional Development) 2011 and was approved with conditions by the Minister of Planning and Public Spaces on 28 July 2020.

The Project includes temporary and permanent works in JO Reserve. JO Reserve is located within Warwick Farm Recreation Reserve and is adjacent to the rail corridor, on the eastern side. JO Reserve is managed by Liverpool City Council (LCC) and currently has 12 softball diamonds which are used for local, district and State competitions and local weekly training sessions predominantly by the Southern District Softball Association (SDSA). JO Reserve is also intermittently used by local school sporting associations during school terms.

As described in the Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) and Submissions Report for the Project, during construction, up to three of the existing 12 softball diamonds (diamonds 3,4 and 5 ) would be temporarily unavailable due to the presence of a construction compound (refer to Figure 2). Construction of the Project is anticipated to commence in 2021 and be completed in 2024.

For the operation of the Project, up to 5 metres of JO Reserve will be acquired for the new rail line. Acquisition of this land will be procured and managed in accordance with the relevant legislation, and is not the subject of this report. Three (diamonds 3,4 and 5 ) of the existing 12 softball diamonds may be required to be moved up to 10 metres east to facilitate the new rail track and realigned Sydney Water assets.

The Project would have no direct or indirect impacts on the usability of diamonds 8-12 as these diamonds are sufficiently distanced from the Project and the potentially impacted diamonds (See Figure 5). As such diamonds 8-12 have not been discussed further in this report.

The EIS and Submissions Report for the Project considered impacts to softball activity and facilities in JO Reserve during construction and operation of the Project and recommended environmental

### 1.2 Purpose of this report

This Report accompanies the Softball replacement facilities design (Appendix A) and demonstrates how the requirements of the Cabramatta Loop Project EIS, Cabramatta Loop Project Submissions Report and the relevant Minister's Conditions of Approval (CoA) dated 28 July 2020, will be met in relation to minimising impacts on softball activities and facilities in JO Reserve during construction and operation of the Project.

This Report demonstrates that the reinstatement of softball diamonds 3, 4 and 5 in JO Reserve (refer to Figure 5) would not likely result in any permanent impacts on the usability of the softball facilities or reduce existing programmed softball activity as a result of the Project.

The compound layout (light blue) and "Edge of proposed embankment" (dark blue) as shown within Appendix A, are subject to detailed construction planning and detailed design.

### 1.2.1 CSSI Approval requirements

Specifically, this Report addresses the requirements of the CoA identified in Table 1 and the revised environmental management measures (REMMs) for the Project identified in Table 2. A cross reference is also included to indicate where the condition is addressed in this Report.

### 1.2.2 Softball Field Guidelines

The Softball Field Guidelines (Softball Australia, 2015) (the Guidelines) is considered the relevant document which provides guidance for determining the dimensions of softball fields. The Guidelines apply to fastpitch (sub-elite and elite international, national and state competitions) and slowpitch (played competitively but typically a popular social and recreational sport) softball divisions. Both fastpitch (summer season) and slowpitch (winter season) competitions are played at JO Reserve.

The Guidelines have been taken into account in the preparation of this Report and the accompanying designs (Appendix A) to guide appropriate dimensions for reinstatement of the three impacted diamonds at JO Reserve.

The Guidelines specify that a softball field comprises 'fair territory' and 'foul territory' as shown in Figure 3. Fair territory is divided into infield and outfield areas defined as:

- Infield: The diamond and the adjacent space in which the infielder's player occupy
- Outfield: Remaining space between the foul lines and between the outfield fence and the infield

The Guidelines also describe how to lay out a softball diamond, including determining the position of the home plate and dimensions of the infield and outfield area for fastpitch and slowpitch divisions across the competition groups. The general dimensions and layout of a softball field are shown in Figure 4. As illustrated in Figure 4, a softball field also typically includes the following components:

- Backstop: The area behind the home plate.
- Bases: $\left(1^{\text {st }}, 2^{\text {nd }} \& 3^{\text {rd }}\right)$ : A home plate is at one corner of the diamond, and the bases are located in each of the remaining corners (counter-clockwise numbering for $1^{\text {st }}, 2^{\text {nd }}$ and $3^{\text {rd }}$ bases).
- Batters boxes: Rectangular area next to the home plate where the batter must stand to hit the pitch.
- Coaches boxes $\left(1^{\text {st }} \& 3^{\text {rd }}\right)$ : Boxes located in foul territory outside both baselines.
- Foul lines $\left(\mathbf{1}^{\text {st }} \& 3^{\text {rd }}\right)$ : The field is defined by foul lines that meet at a right angle at the home plates. This area is typically fenced.
- Home plate: Rubber base where the batter stands.
- Pitching circle: In fastpitch, the pitching circle is located around the pitching rubber.
- Pitching rubber: Located near the centre of the diamond.

Softball field dimensions and layouts are identified in the Guidelines by competition type and category; however, it is noted that specific dimensions for fastpitch and slowpitch categories are standard international dimensions which would be required to hold international championships and tournaments.

The relevant dimensions which determine the outer radius and limits of a softball field are the outfield fence line and the distance required between the home plate and the two foul lines.

The Guidelines recommend that softball fields should have a minimum distance of 7.62 metres from home plate to the backstop as shown in Figure 4. The minimum outfield fence dimensions vary between competition type and are summarised in Table 3. It is also recommended there is a $4-5$ metre 'warning
track' from the outfield fence although this is not required where the field being played on is larger than the minimum dimensions.

As identified in Table 3, the minimum outfield dimension for the women's competition is 67.06 metres (in fastpitch and slowpitch) and the minimum outfield dimension for the men's competition is 76.20 metres (fastpitch and slowpitch).

Outfield dimensions for Tball competitions are not specified, however the baseline minimum for fastpitch and slowpitch is 18.29 metres.

## 2 Consultation

ARTC's values commit the organisation to active engagement with stakeholders and the community. Effective communication and stakeholder engagement are fundamental to reducing risk, optimising the project design, and minimising social and environmental impacts.

ARTC has worked closely with SDSA and LCC to understand in detail, how the softball facilities and JO Reserve is used and to develop a detailed approach to managing any residual impacts. Further, LCC and SDSA have been invited to provide feedback on this draft report and in particular the proposed mitigation approaches.

Key comments and issues raised by SDSA and LCC related to retaining existing level of activities through construction and operations, lighting specifications, replacement facilities meeting relevant guidelines, and potential interface with future LCC works.

The detail of the comments or issues raised during consultation and how they have been addressed in this report is outlined in Appendix C. The record of the key consultation activities conducted with each stakeholder in development of this report and accompanying design can be found at Appendix B.

ARTC and its preferred Contractor will continue to consult and work closely with these key stakeholders during the construction and operation of the Cabramatta Loop Project. A summary of the consultation activities undertaken with each stakeholder can be found at Appendix B. Other evidence is held by ARTC and can be provided on request to the Secretary or Environmental Representative.

Note that a submission was received from SDSA as part of the EIS exhibition. As that was addressed in the Submissions Report, it has not been discussed in detail here. LCC did not make a submission during the EIS exhibition period.

## 3 Existing softball activity and facilities

### 3.1 Softball facilities and layout

JO Reserve is located within Warwick Farm Recreation Reserve, east of the rail corridor. JO Reserve contains the following infrastructure which constitutes the softball facilities:

- 12 softball diamonds
- administrative office, including canteen and amenities including toilets
- lighting
- fencing around the southern perimeter
- cages/ fencing around diamond 1
- storage containers used for local, district and State competitions and local weekly training sessions by the SDSA.

The primary user of the softball facilities is SDSA, however these facilities are also utilised by a number of school sports associations throughout the year.
The primary vehicular access route to JO Reserve is along the Railway Parade access road which runs along the western side of the rail corridor and connects to the Reserve via an underpass. This access road is gated at the connection to Station Street as well as at the underpass, with the gate at connection to Station Street requiring either a Council key and/or Rail Corridor key to access. The gates at the underpass can only be opened with a council key. All gates remain closed and locked throughout the year as a measure to prevent unauthorised vehicles entering JO Reserve. There is also access via a gate and private access road to Sappho Road (which runs through the Warwick Farm Hometown Centre) to the south.
Parking is available on the bitumen surface within JO Reserve. The SDSA website also indicates that parking within the Hometown Centre may also be utilised.
The general layout of the existing 12 softball diamonds in JO Reserve is shown in Figure 5. Diamonds 1-7 are located on the western side of JO Reserve, adjacent to the rail corridor, and diamonds 8-12 are located on the eastern side of JO Reserve adjacent to the Hume Highway. Details of the existing dimensions for diamonds 1-7 are as provided by SDSA and are detailed in Table 4 below.

In addition, ARTC has undertaken a survey and developed a plan of the existing layout, based on existing infrastructure and applying a 72.6 metre outfield. This is included in Appendix $A$ as the Current Layout and the overlap for a men's fastpitch match is shown in Table 4.

### 3.2 Use of softball facilities

SDSA identified that the maximum outfield dimension of the softball diamonds at JO Reserve is typically " 225 ff " equating to around 69 metres (refer Table 4) although they are often marked up to 72 metres for competition where there is overlap between adjacent fields. It is noted that the 69 metre outfield complies with the minimum outfield dimensions for international standard women's competitions under the Softball Field Guidelines (2015), however, it is below the minimum outfield dimensions for most international standard men's competitions. For adult games, the diamonds are set-up to allow 60 feet ( 18.3 metres) between each base and the home plate to foul line. The softball diamonds are measured and set-up by SDSA every weekend during competition seasons and tournaments.

As diamonds 5 and 6 overlap somewhat, diamond 5 is typically only used for $T$-ball (simplified version of softball generally played by children under the age of 10 ).

The existing softball diamond dimensions, design and facilities for diamonds 1-7 at JO Reserve provided by SDSA is detailed in Table 4.

### 3.3 Programmed use of the facilities

CoA E30 requires that the existing level of programmed softball activity at JO Reserve is maintained at all times during construction and operation of the Project.

In order to understand the typical and current programmed softball activity for the 2019-2020 period, ARTC consulted with SDSA and LCC during preparation of the Project's EIS and the preparation of this Report and the design at Appendix A. Through this consultation, it was identified that the primary user of the JO Reserve is the SDSA, although the fields are also used intermittently throughout the year by local school sport associations.

Table 5 outlines the softball activity in JO Reserve that was programmed for the 2019-2020 period, including summer and winter competitions, tournaments and training. Table 5 has been developed based on the competition and training schedules provided by SDSA for the 2019-2020 period, tournament schedules available on the Softball Australia website and through information provided by SDSA and additional information provided by LCC regarding local school sports associations who use JO Reserve during the school year.

It is noted that due to the Government COVID-19 restrictions, SDSA scheduled softball games and practice in JO Reserve ceased during the period of March - June 2020. The summer 2019-2020 season has been considered representative of this period as games were scheduled in advance for the season. Similarly, the winter 2019 competition was considered as opposed to the winter 2020 competition due to the potential impact of COVID-19 restrictions on scheduling during 2020.

The level of softball activity is much higher during the summer period than the winter period, where games are generally held each weekend between October and March and tournaments held throughout September. In 2019, one softball tournament was held at JO Reserve across one weekend (Saturday \& Sunday). In 2020, two softball tournaments were planned at JO Reserve across two weekends (Saturday \& Sunday).

School use of the facilities occurs year round.
A copy of the schedules provided by SDSA for the 2019-2020 period is provided in Appendix D.

## 4 Impacts and proposed mitigation approach

The impacts and proposed approach to mitigation discussed below are based upon the existing level of programmed softball activity described in Section 3.1.3 above.

### 4.1 Construction

### 4.1.1 Impacts during Construction

The Project would result in the temporary removal of diamonds 3,4 and 5 during construction only due to the presence of a construction compound. On completion of construction, diamonds 3,4 and 5 would be reinstated up to 12 metres east of their current location due to the presence of the passing loop and embankment (discussed further below in Section 4.2.1).
As anticipated by the EIS, access to JO Reserve via Railway Parade may be restricted for a period of up to two weeks to allow for installation of the bridge deck over Cabramatta Creek and the access from Railway Parade. However, during this time, users can continue to access JO Reserve via Sappho Road and through Hometown Warwick Farm.

Table 6 considers the information provided by SDSA and LCC and provides a summary of how the proposed temporary adjustments could impact upon the existing level of programmed softball activity.
The existing level of activity programmed during summer or winter softball competitions is not expected to be impacted during construction, as these diamonds are not typically allocated to any programmed competition games.
With regards to SDSA activities, diamonds 3, 4 and 5 are typically only used during tournament weekends where all softball diamonds in JO Reserve are typically utilised for the entirety of the tournament (Saturday \& Sunday) due to the increased number of games played during daytime hours $8: 30 \mathrm{am}$ to 5 pm . Temporary removal of diamonds 3,4 and 5 during construction of the Project would therefore constrain the number of games which can be played during that daytime period. This impact would occur over at least three weekends annually.

School use of the facilities occurs year round, however it is anticipated that given this is not a tournament or gala day, it is general use of the grounds rather than all diamonds at one time. In any case, this is for a short period of the day which could be extended to accommodate additional time at the reserve. The project is not anticipated to impact the programmed activity undertaken by schools.
Consultation with the Bernera Zone Secondary School Sports Association indicated that approximately four annual Gala Days were held at JO Reserve, however all softball activities on these days would take place on diamonds 8 to 12 within the eastern section of JOR. The Project would have no direct or
indirect impacts on the usability of diamonds 8-12 as these diamonds are sufficiently distanced from the Project and the potentially impacted diamonds (See Figure 5).

### 4.1.2 Approach to mitigate impact

The impacts identified relate to a constraint on capacity for gala-style days where all diamonds are in use during daytime hours as well as inconvenience due to constraints on access for isolated construction events where Railway Parade access may be temporary closed.

To mitigate potential constraints on capacity for gala-style days, the Project would provide some temporary lighting. Lighting currently exists at fields 1,6 and 7 . Temporary lighting will also be provided by the project at field 2 to allow for the period of play to be extended into the evening during these tournaments and allow four diamonds to be utilised. The request for provision of lighting for SDSA and School Sports gala-style days should be made by the relevant party directly to ARTC with at least 3 months' notice.

Diamond 2 was selected as the preferred location for temporary lighting as it is unlikely to cause further impact to the Grey-headed flying fox colony given its proximity and that there are already two lit diamonds between diamond 2 and the colony. Additionally, it is no closer to residential properties than existing lit diamonds. Potential light spill will be verified upon installation. The project Infoline will also be made publicly available in accordance with the Communication Strategy (as per CoA B3) should the community or nearby residents wish to enquire or raise any concerns about the temporary lighting.

Additionally, at least 3 months' notice of proposed works that could impact the Railway Parade access to JO Reserve will be provided to relevant parties to allow for them to communicate with their members and minimise potential inconvenience.

Table 7 outlines the proposed mitigation approach to manage the impacts identified above.

### 4.2 Operation

### 4.2.1 Impacts during Operation

The EIS anticipated that the partial acquisition of JO Reserve may require the movement of up to three of the existing softball diamonds up to ten metres to the east. This relates to diamonds 3,4 and 5 . However, based on a review of aerial images at the time, this was considered unlikely to impact on the operation of the softball fields. The EIS also established that the need to move the softball diamonds, would be further refined during detailed design and where there is the potential to impact on the existing operation of the softball fields ARTC would consult with LCC and the SDSA. The purpose of this report is to further refine that final design of the relocated facilities in consultation with LCC and the SDSA.

Two options for final alignment of the softball playing facilities were explored. In developing these options, a 76.2 metre outfield (in accordance with the men's fastpitch standard) has been adopted, with a 7.6 metre offset to the foul line and 12 metre offset to the new ARTC boundary:

- Option 1 - This option results in a minor shift of diamonds 3 and 5 of 5.3 and 7.0 metres respectively, however a larger shift of 24.3 metres for diamond 4 is proposed to minimise the existing and potential overlap with adjacent diamond. This option results in no overlap between diamonds 3 and 4 , with at least 5 metres between their closest point (diamond 3 center outfield and diamond 4 right foul line). This option also results in a reduced overlap between diamonds 5 and 6 where there would be only 22.5 metres overlap in the left outfield corner, as opposed to 29 metres in the existing (pre-project) scenario.
- Option 2 - this option results in a minor shift of diamonds 3,4 and 5 of $3.12,1.28$ and 4.06 metres respectively. It results in a minor overlap between the center field of diamond 3 and right foul line of diamond 4 as well as an overlap of up to 11.6 metres of the left foul line of diamond 4 and the center field of diamond 5 . This would worsen the existing overlap by around 2 metres. Additionally, diamond 5 would also overlap with diamond 6 by around 32.2 metres in the outfield, worsening the existing overlap by about 3 metres.

Option 1 is considered the preferred option as it not only results in the least impact, but also improves on the existing situation by:

- Removing the minor overlap between diamonds 3 and 4
- Removing the existing overlap of up to 3.4 metres between diamonds 4 and 5 , and
- Reducing the existing overlap between diamonds 5 and 6 from around 29 metres to 22.5 metres.

As such, as a result of the preferred option, there would be no operational impact anticipated, rather there would likely be an improvement where games can be scheduled on more adjacent diamonds
concurrently than in the current alignment. This will likely result in increased flexibility and opportunity in allocating fields for programming future softball activities.

Reinstatement of the playing surface is proposed to be undertaken in consultation with LCC and SDSA during demobilisation of the compound as discussed in Section 4.1.2.

### 4.2.2 Approach to mitigate impact

Diamonds 3,4 and 5 will be reinstated in accordance with the Option 1 layout shown in Appendix A.
Given that no further potential impact is anticipated as a result of the proposed layout for reinstatement of the softball facilities, no additional mitigation is proposed.

## 5 Conclusion

This Report accompanies the Softball replacement facilities design (Appendix A). This report and accompanying design have been developed in consultation with LCC and SDSA.

This report demonstrates how the requirements of the Cabramatta Loop Project EIS, Cabramatta Loop Project Submissions Report and the relevant Minister's CoA, will be met in relation to minimising impacts on softball activities and facilities in JO Reserve during construction and operation of the Project.

This Report demonstrates that with relevant mitigation and the proposed design for the reinstatement of softball diamonds 3,4 and 5 in JO Reserve (refer to Figure 5), will avoid permanent impacts on the usability of the softball facilities and may result in some improvements. As such, no additional facilities or infrastructure is proposed to be introduced as part of this Project.
