

CABRAMATTA LOOP PROJECT

August 2021

ARTC has engaged Fulton Hogan to design and construct the Cabramatta Loop Project. The Project will increase rail freight capacity on the Southern Sydney Freight Line by allowing freight trains travelling in either direction to pass each other. Together with the Botany Rail Duplication, it will build capacity to meet predicted growth in demand for freight to be carried on rail between Port Botany and metropolitan freight intermodal terminals.

WHAT ARE WE DOING?

Fulton Hogan will soon begin early works within the rail corridor of the project boundary, on surrounding local roads and at Jacquie Osmond Reserve. This work will start on Wednesday 25 August and continue until late October. The information from these investigations will be used to finalise the detailed design of the Project.

From Wednesday 25 August 2021, the following early works activities will start on site:

- Establishing a site compound and storage areas at Jacquie Osmond Reserve
- Installing temporary fencing around work areas
- Property condition and road condition surveys
- Utility, geotechnical investigations and potholing around the local road network, particularly along Broomfield Street and surrounding areas. This work involves vacuum excavation, saw cutting of footpaths and surrounding pavement and reinstatement of affected areas.
- Ground survey and topography survey
- Setting up dust measuring monitors and sediment controls.

HOW MIGHT THIS WORK AFFECT YOU?

Work will be carried out between 7am and 6pm Monday to Friday and 8am to 1pm on Saturdays. There may be some work required at night in some locations to reduce impacts on traffic. Nearby residents and stakeholders will be notified in advance of any scheduled night work.

Major construction will commence in early 2022, with the project scheduled for completion in mid-2024. Our team will continue to update the community regularly on new construction activities as they occur.

Work dates are scheduled around current government rules and restrictions for Greater Sydney and may be subject to change. The project is committed to operating in a COVID-safe way.

TRAFFIC

There will be temporary traffic changes during our work hours to ensure the work areas are safe. These work areas include Broomfield Street, Railway Parade, Station Street and Sappho Road. Traffic changes include short term lane closures and localised diversions for pedestrians.

Please keep to the speed limits and follow signs and traffic controllers' directions. WEEKEND RAIL POSSESION

We have limited opportunity throughout the year to access the rail corridor. On Saturday 4 and Sunday 5 September between 6am and 6pm there is a pre-planned track closure. During this possession Fulton Hogan will be carrying out geotechnical investigations, survey works, and signal investigations. This work will occur in the rail corridor between Cabramatta Station and Warwick Farm Station.

SITE COMPOUND - JACQUIE OSMOND RESERVE

To support construction, a site compound will be established in the south western corner of Jacquie Osmond Reserve.

This compound will be used for site offices, stockpile areas, a storage yard, staff amenities and parking facilities. Staff, machinery and light vehicles will enter the compound via Sappho Road and Station Street.

This is a temporary compound only and will be removed when the project is completed in 2024.


The compound will be based on an area currently used for three of the six softballs diamonds in this section of Jacquie Osmond Reserve. The fields and any other affected public open space will be reinstated following project completion.

ARTC has been consulting regularly with softball playing groups about the compound and proposed works and will continue to do so throughout construction.
